

# FPAWS Parent Mentoring Program



Partnering with the Foster Care Community and  
Parents to Better Support Children

A child is placed in out of home placement.  
(At any time during the duration of the case a referral can be made  
to the PMP.)

Referrals are made to PMP by  
anyone involved in the case.

(Social Worker, Family Connections Program, Permanency  
from Day 1, Parent 4 Parent, Treatment Court Facilitator,  
Defense Attorney, or a Child Placing Agency.)

Parent Mentoring Program  
(PMP) Assessment Team

(Social Worker, Social & Health Program  
Coordinator, DCYF Parent Mentor Liaison, FPAWS  
PMP Supervisor, FPAWS PMP Regional  
Coordinator)

Complete a case assessment.  
If appropriate a mentor is  
matched to the family.

Mentor, Social Worker  
and Parent meet to agree  
upon an action plan

Mentor Meets with Family for 16  
weeks for one to one mentoring  
sessions. Sessions are focused on  
skill building and facilitating the  
family's service plan.

Service plans may include: job search, obtaining  
housing, connecting with services, complying with  
mental health care, accessing resources, resolving  
legal matters, building a healthy support network.

Mentor provides continuing support.
