- ❖ We prioritize policies that reach children furthest from opportunity first.
- ❖ We lay the foundation for children's life-long learning by creating policies that span from birth to age five.
- ❖ We understand that working together is the key to our success and therefore we are intentional in our commitment to building and maintaining strong relationships with each other grounded in trust and mutual respect.
- ❖ We prioritize children's whole development including social and emotional development, cognitive development, parent engagement, and physical and mental health.
- ❖ We recognize that children learn and grow within the context of relationships with adults and for many families, this includes early learning settings, where a highly effective and fairly compensated early learning workforce is critical to supporting improved outcomes for kids.
- ❖ We support issues that are good for kids, even if they fall outside of our priority focus.
- ❖ We recognize the importance of children's life-long learning opportunities and seek opportunities to partner with allies in K-12 and higher education.
